Last year the voting was three people's choice awards for the entire show. She asked if members would prefer to have a people's choice for each category of quilts. By show of hands members voted to expand the people's choice to include each category of quilts.

Quilt Show Bazaar, Karen Allen & Trudy Coogan: No report.

Quilt Show Miniatures/Silent Auction, Marianne Cohen: Members were given a list of five possible charities to receive proceeds from this event. The ballots were collected to be counted.

Retreat: Barbara Laxson reported that we still did not have a coordinator(s) for our 2023 quilt show. She also stated that the board decided this committee would also handle guild activities and emphasized that new ideas are welcomed for the retreat, including location. Anyone interested should contact Barbara.

Scrap Quilt: Jan Kramme is coordinating the scrap quilt. She asked for a minimum of 5 people to work on this project. They will meet each month after the monthly guild meeting. She asked by show of hands as to whether members preferred a bed-sized quilt or a throw-sized quilt. The vote favored a throw-sized quilt. As a reminder, tickets are sold to members only for \$1 per ticket or \$20 for 24 tickets. The drawing is held in December for a winner.

Sewing Bee & Skill Builders, Roberta Waterfield: Each year there is a special guild exhibit at our quilt show. This year's exhibit titled "La Rouge" will be red and white quilts. The quilt size should be 28" x 28" or 30" x 30". The red must be a true red. NO embellishments accepted.

Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival 2023

As was stated at our April 14th guild meeting, JoAnn Borchelt and I will be the Coordinators for Door Prizes at the 2023 Festival. I'm asking for your help collecting Door Prizes by asking you to ask for donations from quilt shops that you may visit these next several months. The Kansas/Nebraska Shop Hop is in progress right now. It runs through May 31st. The All Missouri Shop Hop is September 1st through October 31st, 2022. Please remember to get a business card to go with the donation. All donations can be given to me.

There will be two levels of judging at the 2023 show – Master Quilters and Artisan Quilters. Master Quilters will be any quilter who has won Best of Show, a 1st place or 2nd place ribbon in a regional or national quilt show. Ribbons in the Master Quilters category will be for Pieced, Applique and Art/Pictorial. The Entry fee for all judged quilts will be \$25 per quilt. These quilts will have been made within the last 3 years, and did not hang in the 2021 Festival. All entries will be done online. The size limit will remain at 96". You can go to the KCRQF website, www.kcrqf.com, for more information.

The Festival dates are June 15th, 16th, and 17th, 2023 at the Overland Park Convention Center, Overland Park, Kansas. Please go to the KCRQF website, www.kcrqf.com, to see all the participating guilds, vendors and sponsors. Be sure to "Like" and "Share" the KCRQF's Facebook page, <https://www.facebook.com/kcrqf/>. You will also find all the information for the Showcase Challenge under the "About Us" tab on the website. If you or a group want to participate in the Challenge, be sure to complete the registration form and mail it in by October 31, 2022. The quilt does not have to be completed by that date.

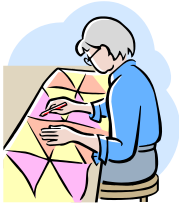
