

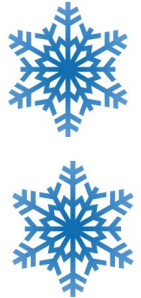

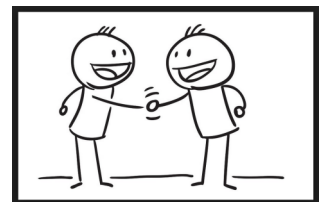

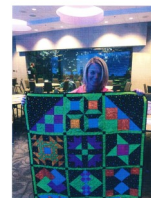
Windy dropping off the quilts to our United Way office

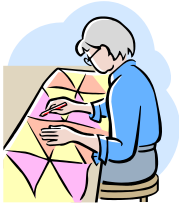
