January 13, 2022

The meeting was called to order by president Barbara Laxson.

Minutes/Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's report printed in the last newsletter was approved by the members. The minutes printed in the last newsletter was approved by members.

Old Business: Shirley Green was installed as Treasurer for 2022. Our guild retreat for 2022 was cancelled due to Covid. The guild will lose the deposit we paid in 2019. The retreat center is unwilling to carry our deposit over more than one year and we risked losing more because we only had 5 out of the ten sleeping rooms reserved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Historian: Jo Forsythe: No report.

Hospitality: Leah Stanley, Terri Schroder: Terri Schroder reported that we had 57/58 members at the Christmas lunch. Because of the recent Covid surge, no drinks were served at today's meeting.

KC Regional Quilt festival: Planning meetings for the 2023 KCRQF will begin later this spring.

Memory Makers: Beth Curasi: Currently, we have two quilts to baste at Sew Bee in both January and February.

Mini Groups: The Quilts of Valor group will no longer be meeting.

Newsletter: Rhonda Thiedke: Doris Torres will be working with Rhonda Thiedke and when Rhonda relocates, Doris will replace her as editor.

Opportunity Quilt: JoAnn Borchelt: JoAnn showed a sample of the block that will be used for our 2022 Opportunity Quilt. Members were asked to donate jewel-toned fabrics, preferably WOF or FQs. The pattern she is using is "Evolution."

Programs: Donna Brattin: At today's meeting Pat Peterson presented our guild's collection, Men and Women of Missouri. February we will have our annual basket sale. Members are asked to bring a filled basket with a minimum value of \$10. Members will be able to buy one of these baskets at the meeting. In addition, members may bring items for a silent auction and we also will be playing bingo. Watch for more detail in the next newsletter.

Quilted Blessings: Teddie Broughton: Teddie was not at today's meeting. If you have charity quilts to donate you may bring them to the meeting next month or contact Teddie to arrange getting them to her.

The options were to continue the annual shows if there are enough volunteers, to hold the show every other year to alternate with the KCRQF if there are sufficient volunteers or to discontinue the quilt show. There were no votes to discontinue the quilt show. A strong majority voted to hold the show annually.

Quilt Show Bazaar: It was reported that we may have someone to coordinate the Quilt Show Bazaar. It will be confirmed later. We will be needing volunteers to help.

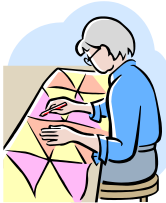
