Membership: Nancy Bellis – There were 86 members present. We currently have 121 members.

Minutes/Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's report and minutes from the previous meeting were approved as written in the newsletter.

Old Business: Donna announced that our storage space has been organized and the new cabinet is being used.

New Business: Donna announced that we will need three individuals for the officer nominating committee. If anyone is interested, please speak to her. Dave is out of the hospital and would like to resume cleaning sewing machines and sharpening scissors at the monthly Sewing Bee. However, we have had a problem in the past of individuals saying they will bring their machine and then not bringing it. Dave pays someone to bring him and no shows can make it an unprofitable day for him. In the future members will be asked to reserve their place by completing a form and making a \$20 non-refundable deposit.

Scrap Quilt: Barbara Laxson – Barbara showed a sample block for this quilt. She can use more cream/light color fabric for the quilt. This quilt will be used for the guild member drawing in December.

Quilt Show: Trish Rogers – This month's quilt show meeting will be April 25, 6:30 p.m. at the Hillside Christian Church where this year's show will be held. Anyone interested in seeing the facility is welcome to come.

If you haven't heard, *Never Alone* is our charity this year. *Never Alone* provides a hot meal each week for the homeless and low income families. It also provides a clothes closet, school supplies and back packs for the children and they have a weekly Bible study. Be a part of the Silent Auction this year by donating a hand made item or working together to make a theme basket.

Hand made items include: Miniature Quilts – no side to exceed 24 inches; Wall Hangings – no side to exceed 40 inches; Table Toppers/Runners; Baby Quilts – maximum size 45"x 50"; and Lap quilts

Panels/cheater cloth are accepted, but only if embellished.

Please put a label on your hand made item with the name of the quilt show, (Hearts and Flowers Galore) and the year.

The basket(s) should have a value of at least \$30, as that will be the starting bid price. It should also contain an item that has been hand made, such as napkins, coasters, a table runner or whatever the hand made item would be based on the theme of your basket or fat quarters.

At our August meeting, we will be voting on the hand made items donated, (miniatures, wall hangings, table toppers, etc.) and ribbons will be awarded.

You can turn in your hand made items/baskets at each guild meeting through September.

Quilt Festival Notes and Reminders

The Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival (KCRQF) is June 13,14, 15 at the Overland Park Convention Center.

Please remember to go to KCRQF and add your name to the white glove volunteer list. Currently only 1/3 of the needed positions are filled. Each shift is for 1 hour. All volunteers are entered into a drawing to win a sewing machine.

Judge quilt entry is full. Each entrant will receive an email as to the date, time and location of where to deliver your quilt(s). Ribbons will be placed on the quilts on Saturday. 75% of the entrants were local. The other 25% are from all over the USA.

Please sign up on line if you wish to have a quilt appraised. There is a \$70 fee for a written appraisal, \$30 for a verbal appraisal.

Pre-ordered tickets ordered in May may be picked up at the will call desk in the lobby. Merchandise may be picked up at the Merchandise booth inside the show. **NOTE: I HAVE THE TICKETS AND MERCHANDISE ORDERED IN MARCH AND APRIL. I WILL DISTRIBUTE AT THE MAY NORTHLAND GUILD MEETING.**

Show parking: Additional parking and shuttles will be provided at Marriott Hotel and McDonald's located at Woodson and Metcalf. Rosana Square will have a shuttle running every 30 minutes.

Silent Auction: Bidders receive a ticket with a number after completing a form with your name and contact information.. The number is used to place your bid on the bid forms. No names on the forms, only numbers.

Tickets are still available for the preview night and for the Ricky Timms concert. The Ricky Timms concert tickets have been offered to the public so get your tickets soon.

Roberta and I will collect the quilts that the Northland Guild is displaying at the **June 6** Guild meeting. Please be sure to have a label and a 4" sleeve on your quilt (3.5" will not do for the sleeve). Also note that the **June guild meeting is the first Thursday of June**, not the second as normal. We will return your quilts after the show, either at the July guild meeting or earlier.

Diane White will bring the KCRQF Opportunity Quilt to our May guild meeting. She will have tickets available for purchase (1\$ each or 6 for 5\$) as well as the pattern for the quilt. Take a minute to look at the quilting, it is really special.

The meeting was called to order by Trish Rogers at 6:30pm at Hillside Christian Church.

Registration Forms-Trish Rogers went through all the changes that had been made to the Registration form for this years quilts. Specifically the different sizes for the large, medium and small quilts was removed. The word "By" for piecing, quilting, etc., was added. Any where on the form that specified when items were due was changed to "by the July guild meeting" or "by the September guild meeting". The form will be placed in Dropbox. Any quilts that are going to be judged, the labels need to be covered.

Vendors- Joann Borchelt: There are 13 vendors and 1 on the waiting list. Revenue collected at this time is \$8,075.

Special Exhibit- Roberta Waterfield: There is one packet left, if anyone would like to purchase it and enter it in the challenge. Roberta also described how the exhibit would be set up on the stage at the church. It will be in a "U" shape, with only one way to enter and leave the exhibit.

Silent Auction- Mona Meyers: There will be no baskets containing alcohol, however, sparkling cider may be substituted for wine.

Publicity- Barbara Moyer: Fifteen hundred 'Save the Date' cards have been ordered and an additional 1,000 will be ordered in May. She will order 2500 total for the regional quilt show.

Bazaar- Nancy Bellis attended for Celeste: the Bazaar will be in one room with an overflow room for storage next door. The massage therapist will also be in the overflow room. Nancy is coordinating the cashier(s) for the Bazaar. There will be one (1) cashier and one (1) volunteer at the door.

Ads/Sponsors- Pam Peugh and Joy Behrens: Joy did not attend. However, Trish Rogers mentioned that Joy was in California and would be purchasing black fabric to make more drapes.

Admissions- Trudy Coogan: The position from the Nitetime Needlers to help with Admissions on Saturday has not been filled.

Signs- Phyllis Carlyle: She will start working on next year's quilt show logo for the theme "Windows of Quilting". Phyllis also mentioned that she would need help putting out signs. Anyone who needs a sign for their section should email Phyllis. Jan Maxfield attended to ask about providing food for the days of the quilt show. Hope.Wrx will be providing the lunch. Gwen Weakley will provide previous menus to Jan as suggestions on what to prepare.

Trish Rogers asked about using Hillside Christian Church next year for our quilt show. It was decided that she would see how things went this year, but was going to ask the church if a hold could be put on next year's dates, 9-18-20 and 9-19-20.

The next Quilt Show meeting will be May 23, 2019 at 6:30 pm at Gashland United Methodist Church.

The meeting was adjourned.
