## Northland Needlers Quilt Show Meeting Minutes

October 27, 2022

Meeting was call to order at 6:30 pm

Attendees: Joann Thomas, Debbie Davidson, Mary Cason, Trudy Coogan, Roberta Waterfield, Vicki Nagayama, Gwen Weakley, Debbie Moore, Marci Hanikel, Jean Newton, Trish Rogers, Phyllis Carlyle, Pam Peugh, Brenda Pfannenstiel, and Barbara Laxson.

### Item 1: Treasurer's report:

Vicki presented a Year End overview of income and expenses. There are a couple of expenses outstanding that she will add. Joann & Debbie will ask for volunteers at the guild meeting to audit the financial reports. Once that is completed any proceeds that exceed the \$10,000 retention can be distributed in December to the guilds **OR** if the guild desire they may vote to have the show retain the overage.

### Item 2: Procedures updates:

- **Bazaar** – complete and in Dropbox
- **Silent Auction** – in process
- **Ribbons** – complete and in Dropbox. Need get the Pastor ribbon done during set up.
- **Quilt Registration, Turn In & Release** – in process suggested that they ask Jane Bromberg for feedback on release based on this year's experience.
- **Equipment File** – in process
- No other procedure info discussed

### Item 3: Reports/Discussion on functions:

- a. Bazaar – Sales: \$4,093.39
  - Trudy Coogan said the bazaar did well but still had a lot to donate. Goods were very good quality this year. Only about ½ of the books sold. Leftovers went to Sew Labs, Scraps KC, and Hillcrest.
- b. Sponsors - Sales: \$400 plus \$96 for donated gift certificate to the Barn
  - Proceeds were booked in Vendors. Vicki will correct
- c. Vendors - Sales: \$ 1650.00
  - We had 6 vendors with 2 signed up with deposit of \$25 each for 2023.
- d. Publicity – Brandy ?? from the day guild will take over the online duties for 2023. In total we printed 2000 business card and only had 20 or so left.
- e. It was noted that both guilds ran out of Guild cards for their Opportunity Booths. Need more for next year.
- f. Special Exhibit
  - We received lots of excellent comments on the exhibit from the show patrons. We extended the exhibit to the KCQRF for 2023, but they already have 2 traveling shows.
- g. General Discussion
  - Regarding smaller quilts such as art and crazy, we need a better hanging method. Discussion centered on requiring sleeves, but don't want people to not enter because of that requirement. Tabled for further research.
  - Food service – question was asked if we should approach the church to again serve food. Their kitchen is NOT licensed by KCMO, so they would have to cater which would lower their proceeds considerably. Unlikely.
  - Need to reinstitute the use of name tags so workers and patrons know who is who.
  - The office needs to be considered a “work space” for counting money, counting ballots, etc. We need to promote a “lounge area” with comfortable seating and snacks & water for workers.
  - Viewer's Choice voting - question was raised do we want to move to this permanently. There was some dissent to leave it as an annual vote. Additionally, we need to print approximately 500 ballots.

## Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival 2023

I hope all of you have been checking the KCRQF website to, [www.kcrqf.com](http://www.kcrqf.com), see all the updates about the Festival taking place on June 15th, 16th, and 17th, 2023 at the Overland Park Convention Center, Overland Park, Kansas.

Take a look at the instructors for the Festival. You can read about each of them when you go to the "Class Info" tab. All of the instructors should be there by January 1st.

Also, be sure to check out our Sponsors and thank them if you happen to visit their booth.

Be sure to mark your calendars for January 1, 2023 when classes will be posted to the website. You will be able to register for those classes beginning January 15, 2023 at 12:01AM. Registration will close June 9, 2023. There is no early registration for guilds.

Tickets will be bought online this year. You will be able to purchase your ticket(s), buy merchandise and register for any classes all at the same time. You will then print your ticket which will have a Bar Code at the bottom. The Bar Code gets you in to the Festival. Ticket prices are \$15/1day, \$30/3days or \$17 at the door. There will be a separate \$12 Saturday Only ticket available which must be purchased ahead of time. Tickets for children 4-12 years of age are \$10. Children 3 and under are free.

Sandy Gard, this year's quilt judge, will give a tour of the judged quilts to the first 50 people on Thursday, June 15th. The ticket price for this tour is \$10. The tour will begin at 8:00AM. Sandy will talk about how and what she looks for when judging a quilt. The tour will last about an hour.

Another important date is March 1st. This will be the time to begin registering our guild's quilts that will be on display, not judged, during the Festival. PLEASE consider having your quilt displayed at the Festival. I saw a lot of beautiful quilts at our quilt show. The guidelines for a quilt is on the KCRQF website under the Home Tab – About Us – 2023 Guild Quilt Entries. The deadline for registration is March 31st .

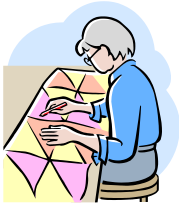
