Minutes of General Meeting August 8, 2019

The meeting was called to order by Donna Brattin, President. She welcomed members and asked if there were any visitors. There were seven visitors today.

Membership: – There were 75 members present.

Minutes/Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's report and minutes from the previous meeting were approved as written in the newsletter.

Old Business: - Nine members went on the Highway 36 shop hop last month.

New Business: **1.** The guild would like to establish an Activities Committee to plan periodic activities such as a bus trip to national quilt shows, shop hop trips, etc. Rhonda Thiedke would be interested in co-chairing this committee if someone would volunteer to work with her. **2.** The guild is also exploring utilizing our meeting space during the afternoons of our monthly guild meetings for periodic presentations by members for members. Donna passed a sign up sheet around for anyone interested in teaching a technique and a sign up sheet for who would be interested in learning a specific technique. This would be done from 1:00 to 3:00 on those afternoons and the guild would pay a fee to the presenter. **3.** The nominating committee has one remaining officer position to fill for next year – Assistant to First Vice President. This is actually a two-year commitment. The First Vice President is the day guilds annual quilt show coordinator. The Assistant to the First Vice President will shadow the First Vice President during 2020 to learn and in 2021 will be the day guild quilt show coordinator. **4.** Nancy Bellis is unable to resume her role for Membership due to medical issues. A new membership person is needed.

The more donations we have the more funds can be raised for our charity *Never Alone*.

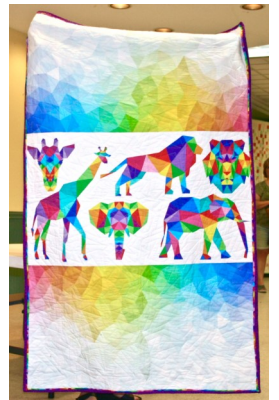

The meeting was called to order on August 22, 2019 at 6:27pm by Patricia Rogers at Gashland United Methodist Church.

Admissions- Trudy Coogan: One day and two day passes will be sold at the September guild meetings. One day admission is \$5.00, two days are \$7.00.

Ads/Sponsors- Pam Peugh and Joy Behrens: Ads are all in. Joy made a special sign with all of the Gold Sponsors.

Bazaar- Celeste Wegner: Celeste asked when the furniture that is in the space where the Bazaar will be set up will be moved? She was told most likely on Wednesday, Sept. 18. Early Bird shopping for **VENDORS ONLY** will begin at 8:20am, Friday, Sept. 20.

Judges- Jane Bromberg: Jane asked Vicki Nagayama for labels to put on the judging sheets. The judges will begin judging around 2:00pm on Thursday, Sept. 19.

Publicity- Barbara Moyer, Brenda Pfannenstiel – Brenda reported that she is getting the word out. She asked all to make sure to use Facebook, or whatever means available to inform people of the quilt show.

Quilt Show Booklet-Gwen Weakley: Gwen sent the booklet out to the quilt show members be reviewed and proof-read. She would like to send it to the printer next week.

Registration- Quilts will be turned in at the September guild meetings. There are 125 quilts.

Ribbons- Jean Newton: Jean brought a set, blue, red and yellow, to show. The “Pastor’s Choice” ribbon will be purple and the “Viewer’s/People’s Choice ribbon will be white.

Set Up/Take Down-Vicki Nagayama: Vicki will pick up the frames on Saturday, August 24 if a part that had to be ordered came in. If not, she will pick them up as soon as it comes in. There will be an area in the gym set up for Door Prizes.

Signs- Phyllis Carlyle: The new logo for the Northland Needlers Quilt Show is now a Compass with a sewing needle. This logo will be used starting in 2020 for all Northland Needlers Quilt Show contracts and anything that has to do with the show. Beginning in 2021, there will no longer be a separate “logo design” for the quilt show. There can be a “theme” for the show, i.e., “Hearts and Flowers Galore”, but there will be no separate logo for that title. A motion to end the use of a separate logo for the quilt show at the end of 2020 was made and it was unanimously voted in favor.

August 22,2019 Minutes

Phyllis asked for a new floor plan so that she will know where to put up signs. Vendors will have their city's name on their signs. Joann Borchelt will provide her with the information. Patricia, or someone will check with Pat Peterson regarding the buckets with cement for the large outdoor signs. Phyllis will get metal frames from Home Depot for the directional signs and parking lot signs which she will have laminated. Roberta will put grommets in the hanging signs.

Silent Auction- Mona Meyers, Teddie Broughton, Carol Sparks, Marci Hainkel: The registration forms will be filled out and put into Dropbox. Mona asked about a cash box and was told there is one to be used.

Special Exhibit- Roberta Waterfield: Roberta has all of the quilts for the Special Exhibit.

Treasurer's Report- Shirley Green: As of this date, August 22, 2019 the bank balance is \$11,363.00.

Vendors- Joann Borchelt: All vendors have paid. Joann sent out an email letting them know their set-up time is from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm. The vendors will give out Door Prize tickets with purchase. Joann is working on the Welcome Bags for the Vendors. Each will contain a Welcome letter, a registration form and a contract for the next year's quilt show. To standardize the fees for the vendor spaces, one space will be \$125, a double will be \$250 and an "off room" will be \$100.

Neither Joann or Jo will be on site on Saturday, Roberta has volunteered to pick up any remaining registration and/or contracts from the vendors.

Website-Kelley Jones: If you have anything to put on the quilt show website, send it to Kelley. Jerriann will send her information about collecting quilts for the Nebraska Flood Victims.

Miscellaneous- The doors will open at 8:00am on Friday and Saturday for workers. Everyone needs to be in place by 9:00am.

Barbara Moyer will be picking up and delivering the new 18" wide tables to Hillside Christian Church on Thursday, Sept. 19.

Purchasing a new computer for the quilt show was discussed. Jane Bromberg made a motion to purchase a new computer, printer and software for the Northland Needlers Quilt Show not exceeding \$750. Joann Borchelt seconded it and it was unanimously voted in favor. There is a printer that belongs to the Northland Quilters Guild that may be used by NNQS, however, NNQS will purchase the ink cartridge to be used during the quilt show.

Some are still working on the new drapes, but most are done.

If you would like to provide morning treats for the workers on Thursday, Sept. 19, please feel free to do so.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 p.m. The next Quilt Show meeting will be October 24, 2019 at 6:30 pm at Gashland United Methodist Church.

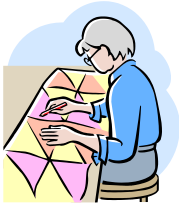
